



2024 Stallholder Terms and Conditions

1. Stallholder applications will be accepted until 5pm Thursday 25 July.
2. While stall sites will not incur a site fee any trader requesting more than 2 power outlets (15amp and/or 10amp) in total may be charged a fee. The fee will be calculated once stall applications are closed and will be determined on a cost recovery basis only if a generator is required to be hired in order to supply requested power.
3. All stallholders must have current \$20 million Public Liability Insurance and this must be submitted with your application.
4. All stallholders must comply with the Single Use Plastics Ban. No single-use plastics straws, stirrers and cutlery, no single-use plastic bowls and plates, no expanded polystyrene (EPS) food service items are permitted to be used by stallholders. Lightweight plastic bags with handles, other than a barrier bag, that are 35 microns or less in thickness at any part of the bag are banned. Lightweight bags made from biodegradable plastics, compostable plastics, or bio-plastics are also banned, including those made from Australian certified compostable plastic. 5. All food stalls must comply with NSW Food Authorities food handling guidelines. For a copy of the guidelines click on links below;

6. No water or sewer will be available to sites.
7. All electrical leads used at the site are to be heavy duty and comply with the requirements of WorkCover NSW. WorkCover NSW requires electrical leads to be tested at least annually, and identification tags to be attached.
8. The holder of any approval is responsible for the collection and disposal of litter associated with, and in the immediate vicinity of the stall. At no time is waste water to be disposed of in the street, gutter or drains. Fines will apply for pollution offences.
9. Gas-fired appliances used in the open should not have a gas bottle greater than 9 kg capacity and the bottle should be secured so that it cannot be tipped over. Gas bottles must have a flame guard, be pressure tested and date stamped within the last ten years.

10. A fire extinguisher and fire blanket must be supplied in any vehicle or stall where cooking or heating processes are undertaken.
11. Stallholders must only sell the items that have been listed in their application.
12. No tobacco, cigarettes, vapes or alcohol are permitted to be sold.
13. Stallholders must behave in a professional and courteous manner.
14. Stallholders must take direction from the event coordinator and other event staff
15. Vendors shall not assign, share or sublet all or part of their site without prior written consent from the event organiser – Tamworth Regional Council.
16. All stalls must comply with the Work Health Safety Act 2011 (NSW).
17. All tents/marquees/structures must be weighted down with ample weights to ensure they are secure. The event will be held on the road so marquees cannot be pegged.
18. All oils must be removed from the site at the end of the event – do not pour oil/waste water down drains.
19. Tamworth Regional Council reserves the right to inspect food stall premises at any time.
20. The stallholder indemnifies Tamworth Regional Council and its employees and volunteers against any and all liabilities, claims and actions that may eventuate from the establishment, operation and removal of any trading premises (stall) during the 2024 A Winter's Night event.
21. No responsibility will be taken for loss or damage to any persons or goods whether or not that loss, damage or injury arises from the negligence of event staff, volunteers or contractors employed by Tamworth Regional Council.
